### Face mask types

#### Surgical masks—for medical use requiring liquid protection

- Intended for surgical use
  - Reduce spread of disease from sneezing and coughing
  - Protect from blood spray and other fluids
- Can look like nonsurgical masks
- Subject to specific government (FDA) oversight
- Disposable

## Nonsurgical masks—for medical use, without requirement for liquid protection

- Intended for nonsurgical medical use
  - Reduce spread of disease from sneezing and coughing
  - Do not protect from blood spray and other fluids
- Subject to specific government (FDA) oversight
- Disposable or reusable

#### Nonmedical masks—for general public use

- Provides protection from inhalation of dust and other particulates such as from construction or road pollution
- Not intended for medical use
  - Cannot claim protection from disease
  - Cannot claim antimicrobial/viral protection
- Includes softline face covers and fashion masks
- Disposable or reusable
